## Opening Remarks by H.E. Mr. Sihasak Phuangketkeow Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Kingdom of Thailand Co-Chair of the 20<sup>th</sup> ASEAN-China Senior Officials' Consultation 22 April 2014 Pattaya City, Thailand

Your Excellency Vice Minister Liu Zhenmin, Excellencies, ASEAN Colleagues,

- Good morning and welcome all distinguished colleagues to the 20<sup>th</sup> ASEAN-China Senior Officials' Consultation.
- I would in particular like to extend my warmest welcome to Vice Minister Liu and members of his delegation to Thailand and to Pattaya.
- It is a **distinct privilege to** have the opportunity **to co-chair** this meeting with Vice Minister Liu.
- Our meeting today is an important one because it is being held after ASEAN and China celebrated the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our strategic partnership last year.
- We should therefore strive to **carry forward the commitments and implement the agreements** that our Leaders made during the ASEAN-China Summit in Brunei last year.
- We should use this opportunity to **set the direction for our future cooperation and elevate our relationship onto a higher plane** as we enter the second decade of strategic partnership.
- On our part, ASEAN very much welcomes statements made by the current Chinese leadership, particularly Prime Minister Li Keqiang, affirming that ASEAN has always been a top priority in China's foreign policy and that ASEAN is an important partner for China in the promotion of peace, stability and prosperity in the region.
- For ASEAN too, China has always been a natural and major partner, bilaterally, regionally and internationally.

- In setting the direction for the future, I wish to **highlight the following points**:
- <u>First</u>, we should ensure that the ASEAN-China partnership continues to be **forward-looking**. We should work together to keep exploring new opportunities and strengthen our cooperation in mutually beneficial areas.
- This meeting will be a **good opportunity for us to discuss many important proposals made by China during last year's Summit**, all of which reflect the importance China attaches to ASEAN.
- <u>Second</u>, we should ensure that this partnership will **continue to be relevant in the context of the changing strategic landscape and the new challenges that confront us** in the region.
- We welcome the emergence of China as a major power committed to the promotion of the peace, stability and prosperity of this region and beyond.
- We welcome the ongoing reforms being undertaken by the Chinese Government which will open up new opportunities for regional growth and development.
- We also welcome the **commitment by China to support ASEAN Centrality**. And we believe that **a strong, proactive and cohesive ASEAN** will certainly benefit China and provide the anchor for regional peace and stability.
- Together, our partnership provides a strong pillar for regional peace and prosperity and will become even more important in the years ahead.
- <u>Third</u>, as ours is a mature partnership, we should have confidence in our ability to manage any challenges or differences that may arise from time to time.
- The success of our meeting yesterday on the issue of the South China Sea reflects our common determination to always keep in mind the bigger picture and manage whatever issues that should emerge between us in a way that will not allow any one issue to define the broader relationship between ASEAN and China.
- Our partnership is deeply-rooted, multi-faceted and dynamic, as evident in the wide range of issues on our agenda that we will be taking up today. I am confident that we will have a very productive and successful meeting today.
